Program outline

The program aims to provide students with the skills and knowledge required to administer influenza vaccination, with a focus on understanding the vaccination requirements for influenza vaccination, the rationale for vaccination and supporting the women's decision-making process.

Program outcome

Upon successful completion of the program students should have the ability to:

- Identify evidence-based resources available for health providers and clients
- Provide a rationale for vaccination of the influenza vaccine to clients
- Discuss influenza vaccination recommendations for clients
- Apply vaccination recommendations for clients.

Program content

The Immunisation Needs for Influenza Program is fully online consisting of blended learning which includes knowledge information, articles, learning videos and self reflection activities.

Program entry requirements

Entrants to the Immunisation Needs for Influenza Program must provide evidence of a relevant professional role and hold one of the following:

- AHPRA registered nursing qualification
- Medical practitioner qualification.

Relevant roles would include:

- Registered and Enrolled Nurses
- General practitioners
- Others on application.

Entrants should have:

- A minimum of three months employment or experience working with clients in a clinical environment

- High language, literacy and numeracy levels – sufficient to interpret medical documents/referrals/requests and write medical notes and reports and

Program structure

To achieve competency students must demonstrate successful completion of:

- Written assessment covering essential knowledge and skills
- Workplace observed practice.

All assessments must be completed in accordance with health and safety standards and infection control policies and procedures.

Workplace observed practice is a mandatory requirement for this course, workplace practice must be observed by a medical practitioner, practice manager or practice nurse that performs the identified workplace tasks as part of their role.

All workplace observed activities must be completed in accordance with workplace policies and procedures of the facility where the activity is being conducted.

The underlying rationale recognises that students are better able to learn when they can control the flow of their experience, or when their learning is self-directed.


A self-directed model of delivery allows access to a broader range of students regardless of geographic location and allows people to complete the program at a pace that suits their current lifestyle and workplace balance.

Successfully completing the pathway means you will have achieved the nationally accredited Course in Immunisation Practice in Primary Healthcare (10754NAT).

You can choose to purchase the pathway all at once or pay and complete one learning at a time – the choice is now yours! In fact, once you have completed your enrolment, you can even choose when to activate your assessment.
