PROGRAM SUMMARY	<p>Immunisation Support for Adults and Older Persons is a nationally accredited online program that aims to provide students with the skills and knowledge required to support vaccination of adults and older persons.</p> <p>This program is part of the second level in The Benchmark Group's Immunisation Support learning pathway. Students must complete the Foundations of Immunisation Support Program prior to entry to this program. On successful completion of this program, students can choose from further level 2 specialty programs (options include immunisation support in pregnancy, influenza and school age clients) , or move on to Level 3 - Support of Immunisation Practice.</p>

Program outline

The program aims to provide participants with the skills and knowledge required to support vaccinations of adults and older persons with a focus on understanding the immunisation guidelines for adult and older persons, the rationale for vaccination and supporting an individual's decision-making process to vaccinate.

Program outcome

Upon successful completion of the program students should have the ability to:

- Source evidence-based resources available for health providers and clients on vaccinations for adults and older persons
- Identify eligible clients for vaccination in accordance with national guidelines and organisation's processes
- Provide information on vaccine recommendations for adults and older persons to clients within scope of own job role.

Program content

The Immunisation Support for Adults and Older Persons Program is fully online consisting of blended learning which includes knowledge information, articles, learning videos and self reflection activities.

Program entry requirements

Entrants to the Immunisation Support for Adults and Older Persons Program must provide evidence of a relevant professional role. Relevant roles would include:

- Medical receptionist
- Practice assistant
- Non-clinical Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Health Workers
- Practice manager.

Entrants should have:

- A minimum of three months employment or experience working with clients in primary health care
- Language, literacy and numeracy levels sufficient to interpret basic medical parameters, respond to requests from health professionals and communicate effectively with clients and public.

Benchmark Group Specific Requirements

Students must complete the Foundations of Immunisation Program prior to entry to this program.

Program structure

To achieve competency students must demonstrate successful completion of:

- Written assessment covering essential knowledge and skills
- Workplace observed practice.

All assessments must be completed in accordance with health and safety standards and infection control policies and procedures.

Workplace observed practice is a mandatory requirement for this course, workplace practice must be observed by a medical practitioner, practice manager or practice nurse that performs the identified workplace tasks as part of their role.

All workplace observed activities must be completed in accordance with workplace policies and procedures of the facility where the activity is being conducted.

The underlying rationale recognises that students are better able to learn when they can control the flow of their experience, or when their learning is self-directed.


A self-directed model of delivery allows access to a broader range of students regardless of geographic location and allows people to complete the program at a pace that suits their current lifestyle and workplace balance.

Following on from this is Supporting Immunisation Practice, consisting of further learning, a face-to-face workshop in partnership with PHNs and workplace activities.

Successfully completing the pathway means you will have achieved the nationally accredited Course in Immunisation Support in Primary Healthcare (10764NAT).

You can choose to purchase the pathway all at once or pay and complete one learning at a time – the choice is now yours! In fact, once you have completed your enrolment, you can even choose when to activate your assessment.
