Course content

The Course in Immunisation Support in Primary Healthcare consists of six individual programs that make up the Immunisation learning pathway. The programs include:

- Foundations of Immunisation Support
- Immunisation Support for Adults and Older Persons
- Immunisation Support for Influenza
- Immunisation Support in Pregnancy
- Support School Aged Immunisation
- Supporting Immunisation Practice.

Course outcome

On the successful completion of the course, students should have the ability to:

- Understand the requirements of the National Immunisation Program
- Support implementation of the National Immunisation Program (NIP) Schedule
- Implement systems and process to support the safe delivery of immunisation services within primary healthcare.

Course structure

Completing all six programs in the Immunisation Support Learning Pathway means you will have achieved the Course in Immunisation Support in Primary Healthcare.

Course delivery and assessment includes online learning completed via accessIQ, a half day face to face workshop, in-class activities assessed by a qualified assessor and a mandatory third party observed workplace activities.

To achieve competency students must demonstrate successful completion of:

- Practical skills simulations and oral questioning
- Written assessment covering essential knowledge and skills
- Workplace observed practice.

All workplace observed activities must be completed in accordance with work health and safety standards and infection control policies and procedures.

Workplace observed practice is a mandatory requirement for this course, workplace practice must be observed by a medical practitioner, practice manager or practice nurse that performs the identified workplace tasks as part of their role.

All workplace observed activities must be completed in accordance with workplace policies and procedures of the facility where the activity is being conducted.

Course entry requirements

Entrants to the Course in Immunisation Support in Primary Healthcare must provide evidence of a relevant professional role. Relevant roles would include:

- Medical receptionist
- Practice assistant
- Non-clinical Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Health Workers
- Practice manager.

Entrants should have:

- A minimum of three months employment or experience working with clients in primary health care
- Language, literacy and numeracy levels sufficient to interpret basic medical parameters, respond to requests from health professionals and communicate effectively with clients and public.

The underlying rationale recognises that students are better able to learn when they can control the flow of their experience, or when their learning is self-directed.


A self-directed model of delivery allows access to a broader range of students regardless of geographic location and allows people to complete the program at a pace that suits their current lifestyle and workplace balance.

Successfully completing the pathway means you will have achieved the nationally accredited Course in Immunisation Support in Primary Healthcare (10764NAT).
