PROGRAM TITLE	Otitis Media Care Pathways - including Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Health Program
PROGRAM SUMMARY	<p>The Otitis Media Management Program is designed to develop the skills and knowledge to safely assess and manage ear health in relation to a range of conditions, with the major focus on physical auditory assessment. Included in this program is Otitis Media specifically in Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander children and adults including social determinants, cultural safety and clinical referral pathways.</p> <p>This program is part of the second level in The Benchmark Group's ear health learning pathway. Students must complete the Foundations of Ear Health Program prior to entry to this program.</p>

Program outline

The Otitis Media Care Pathways - including Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Health Program aims to provide students with the knowledge and skills to assess and determine factors that affect ear and hearing health, assess the client's pathophysiological auditory status and seek advice where appropriate. The major focus is on physical auditory assessment.

Students will also gain knowledge on the requirements to perform ear health assessments, recognise and understand the pathophysiology of otitis media and associated conditions, management planning, and referral processes for further or specialist care in relation to a range of conditions.

Included is Otitis Media specifically in Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander children and adults including social determinants, cultural safety and clinical referral pathways.

Program outcome

Upon successful completion of this program, students should have the skills and knowledge to:

- Assess and manage otitis media and associated conditions
- Consolidate understanding of Otitis Media in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children for determinants, prevention and management pathways.

Program content

The Otitis Media Care Pathways - including Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Health Program will consist of blended learning which includes on-line knowledge information, articles, e-learning videos and self reflection activities and half day workshop.

The course involves detailed information on social determinants of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people, anatomy and physiology, condition recognition, assessment skills including otoscope and referral pathways.

Program structure

To achieve competency students must demonstrate successful completion of:

- Realistic skills simulations and oral questioning in the classroom including 'What if and how to' scenarios
- Written assessment covering essential knowledge and skills
- Workplace observed practice.

Workplace observed practice is a mandatory requirement for this course, workplace practice must be observed by a medical practitioner, practice manager or practice nurse that performs the identified workplace tasks as part of their role.

All workplace activities must be completed in accordance with work health and safety.

Program entry requirements

Entrants must provide evidence of a relevant professional role. Relevant roles would include:

- Registered and Enrolled Nurses
- Allied Health Professionals E.g. Audiologists
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Care Practitioners and Workers
- General Practitioners.

Entrants should have:

- A minimum of six months' employment or experience working with clients in a clinical environment
- High language, literacy and numeracy levels. Sufficient to interpret medical documents/referrals/ requests and write medical notes and reports.

Benchmark Group Specific Requirements

Students must hold the unit EHHPEH002 Promote, educate and manage ear health unit from the Foundations of Ear Health Program.

Ear Health learning pathway

Learning pathways is a new approach where we are giving the control of your learning journey back to you, the student.

The underlying rationale recognises that students are better able to learn when they can control the flow of their experience, or when their learning is self-directed.

A self-directed model of delivery allows access to a broader range of students regardless of geographic location and allows people to complete the program at a pace that suits their current lifestyle and workplace balance.

How it works

The pathway starts by building your base knowledge with the nationally-accredited online program, Foundations of Ear Health. You can then continue on with 4 more nationally-accredited Courses - options are dependent on your current qualifications, and topics include the ear and hearing health (including wax removal), otitis media, tympanometry and microsuction.

You can choose to purchase your pathway all at once or pay and complete one learning at a time – the choice is now yours! In fact, once you have completed your enrolment, you can even choose when to activate your assessment.
