Program outline

The Perform Peripheral Intravenous Cannulation Program is evidence based and the techniques taught are designed to promote the best practice outcomes for patient care.

The program is designed to provide students with the skills and knowledge required to perform peripheral intravenous cannulation on clients.

Program outcome

On completion of this program students will be able to:

- Assess the need for cannulation and correctly identify pathology requests and client
- Perform peripheral intravenous cannulation
- Choose the appropriate size cannula
- Discuss the considerations that influence the correct selection of intravenous cannula size and insertion site
- Demonstrate the technique of peripheral intravenous cannula insertion, including securing the cannula insitu
- Manage the cannula until the time it is no longer required and removal of the cannula is to be performed
- Safely remove the intravenous cannula
- Trouble shoot problems
- Discuss and manage possible complications.

Program content

This program will enable participants to enhance their ability to successfully prepare for, perform and monitor peripheral intravenous cannulation.

Program structure

To achieve competency in this course, students must successfully:

- Perform intravenous cannulation in a simulated environment
- Complete an assessment covering essential knowledge and skills
- Complete three (3) workplace observed peripheral intravenous cannulations

Workplace observed practice is a mandatory requirement for this course, work place practice must be observed by a supervisor that performs the identified tasks as part of their role.

All workplace activities must be completed in accordance with work health and safety standards and all other relevant workplace policies and procedures.

The minimum cost for delivery is \$3900. A discount is available if you are able to provide venue hire for the event.

Please note, closed footwear is required for the workshop.
