PROGRAM SUMMARY	The Supporting Immunisation Practice Program aims to provide students with the skills and knowledges required to implement safe immunisation support in primary healthcare, including system and processes, effective communication and catch-up schedules.

Program outline

The program aims to provide participants with the skills and knowledge required to:

- Understand the National Immunisation Strategy, National Immunisation Program and National Immunisation Schedule within Australia
- Support factors that affect the promotion of immunisation and reporting requirements for vaccination
- Demonstrate knowledge of vaccines applicable to support the preparation of a catch-up schedule for an individual client in accordance with the National Immunisation Schedule guidelines for Catch-up, with a focus on understanding vaccines on the National Immunisation Schedule, including minimal intervals and interactions to facilitate a client being 'up to date' for protection against vaccine-preventable disease.

Program outcome

Upon successful completion of the program students should have the ability to:

- Demonstrate knowledge of the National Immunisation Program and the National Immunisation Program Schedule
- Access the national Strive for 5 guidelines for the management of vaccines
- Access and implement organisation's vaccine management protocol
- Support processes for the management of a cold chain breach
- Report adverse events to supervisor • Identify strategies aimed at increasing immunisation coverage
- Access immunisation data bases and tools
- Review organisational recall and reminder systems
- Demonstrate knowledge of the management and reporting of adverse events following immunisation
- Demonstrate knowledge of the requirements for the delivery of a safe immunisation service
- Demonstrate knowledge of the principles of immunisation documentation protocols
- Demonstrate knowledge of resources available to respond to clients questions related to catch-up vaccination
- Develop a catch-up schedule in accordance with the recommendations from the current Australian Immunisation Handbook.

Program content

The Supporting Immunisation Practice Program consists of blended learning including online knowledge information, articles, videos and self reflection activities and a half day workshop.

Program entry requirements

Entrants to the Supporting Immunisation Practice program must provide evidence of a relevant professional role. Relevant roles would include:

- Medical receptionist
- Practice assistant
- Non-clinical Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Health Workers
- Practice manager.

Entrants should have:

- A minimum of three months employment or experience working with clients in primary health care
- Language, literacy and numeracy levels sufficient to interpret basic medical parameters, respond to requests from health professionals and communicate effectively with clients and public.

Benchmark Group Specific Requirements

Students must have completed the Foundations of Immunisation Program and at least one of the following programs prior to entry to this program:

- Immunisation Support in Pregnancy
- Immunisation Support for Influenza
- Immunisation Support for Adult and Older Persons
- Support School Age Immunisation.

Program structure

To achieve competency students must demonstrate successful completion of:

- Written assessment covering essential knowledge and skills
- In-class activities assessed by a qualified assessor
- Workplace observed practice.

All assessments must be completed in accordance with health and safety standards and infection control policies and procedures.

Workplace observed practice is a mandatory requirement for this course, workplace practice must be observed by a medical practitioner, practice manager or practice nurse that performs the identified workplace tasks as part of their role.

All workplace observed activities must be completed in accordance with workplace policies and procedures of the facility where the activity is being conducted.

Immunisation Support learning pathway

You can choose to purchase the pathway all at once or pay and complete one learning at a time – the choice is now yours! In fact, once you have completed your enrolment, you can even choose when to activate your assessment.
