All irrigation practices and assessments are performed on a mannequin.</p> <p>The workshop focuses on wax removal using irrigation including the legal and consent issues involving ear irrigation.</p>

You will learn the skills and knowledge required to safely undertake an ear assessment and will be assessed in the classroom by a clinical trainer. On successful completion of the course, you will be accredited in ear wax removal (irrigation) and therefore workplace-ready.

Please note, that all irrigation activities in your workplace must be undertaken in accordance with your workplace policies and procedures and as per manufacturers guidelines

Course outcome

Upon successful completion of the program students should have the ability to:

- Understand the basic anatomy and function of the ear including the basic landmarks of the tympanic membrane
- Assess the ear to define the appropriate wax management decision, identify the risks and risk management considerations.
- Recognise complications of ear irrigation, and appropriate management, documentation, and follow up processes.
- Understand the competencies required for successful ear irrigation.

Course content
